

Miller Peak Wilderness parking or shuttle options: one-way or partial loop

Coronado National Memorial officials allow hikers to park overnight at Montezuma Pass but want contact information for security reasons. No permit is required. Call the Memorial at (520) 366-5515 to convey this information or visit monument headquarters during its hours 8 am to 4 pm seven days a week. The National Park Service wants to know:

- vehicle make and model
- license plate
- vehicle owner name
- contact phone number

Park Service also offers visitor shuttle from the monument but ask about scheduled pickup times; it was not clear from the website.

Ramsey Canyon Nature Preserve is closed Tues/Weds but otherwise open 8 am to 5 pm (Mar 1-Oct 31) or 9 am to 4 pm (Nov 1-Feb 28), staffed by volunteers, and has a small parking lot. We got permission to leave a vehicle as it was off season and our timing worked out with preserve schedule. Contact The Nature Conservancy state office 602-712-0048 or Tucson office 520-622-3861 to explore options. You can also leave a vehicle at large public trailhead parking lot on Ramsey Canyon road 1.4 miles before the preserve which solves after-hours problems but is not as secure.

Tucson shuttle services pick up Arizona Trail thru-hikers at Tucson Airport and shuttle to Coronado Monument and might be able to arrange a pickup at the preserve or other trailheads in the wilderness. Call for rates and options.
